Grammar:

SHALL is a modal with different meanings:

1/ Suggestion

As a question including I (I or We), you can make a suggestion.

Example: Shall I open the door

Shall we turn on the aircon?

2/ Future

It is a formal form of future. The English use it more than other English-speaking countries.

Example: I shall arrive at 10 = I will arrive at 10

'Will' can be biased: it can include the idea of willingness. However, SHALL is an objective reference to the future.

3/ Question tag

When using the imperative form 'let's ', we use SHALL as the question tag to ask for confirmation.

Example: Let's eat, shall we!

4/ DUTY

We use SHALL in old and formal English to express orders or requirements.

It is an equivalent to the phrase 'You will not because you must not'

It has two negative forms: SHALL NOT or SHAN'T

The 10 commandments for example use SHALL

Example: You shall not kill
