Snakes and ladders

Grammar: RECIPROCITY

We show reciprocity using 2 different phrases 'EACH OTHER' and 'one another'.

Example:

My best friend and I love each other. 2 elements here

I have 4 brothers and sisters, we really care for one another: more than 2 element here.

1/ EACH OTHER

We show reciprocity between two people when we use the phrase 'EACH OTHER'

Example:

Jim and Lindsay are looking at each other

They already met (each other) in Dallas

2/ one another

We show reciprocity between three people or more when we use the phrase 'one another'

Example:

Liam, Dylan and Trevor are looking at one another

Economically speaking, these 6 countries support one another

3/ Some exceptions

In other languages, the phrases below require 'each other, or one another. In English, they don't. To meet (in this sense) Let's meet next Friday!

To marry (I marry John / John BUT we marry in July)

To split/break up (they split last summer / the broke up last summer)
