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Grammar :

a) ALWAYS refers to a permanent action.

Example: I always dress in black

b) Again refers to a repeated action:

Example : It's raining again

She's lat again

c) ALREADY refers to an action that is over or a state.

Example: It is spring already

d) NOT YET refers to a non-commenced or non-terminated action.

Example: it is not summer yet, we're in April!

e) STILL refers to an action that is in progress but is not permanent.

Example: It is still raining / we're still in winter

I still smoke / he still goes to the gym.



Dialogue:

SEASONS CHANGE

Wentworth: Hi? Sarah! How are you?

Sarah: I'm fine, thank you. I'm sorry I'm in a hurry. I'll see you later.

Wentworth: Are you coming to Sam's exhibition?

Sarah: Yes, I am. I always go to Sam's exhibition because he's my friend. But first, I need to buy new trousers for work.

Wentworth: Don't you have a uniform?

Sarah: No, I don't. They recommend that we come dressed in a white top and black trousers. The top can be a shirt or a tee-shirt. The trousers must be black. They must be good quality. I wear at least 3 pairs in a week. And now that it's hot again, I need to buy new ones for the season.

Wentworth: What's the season, now?

Sarah: It's spring already.

Wentworth: Not yet, actually. It is still winter. Everybody wears coats, scarves and gloves. Some wear boots or wholly hats. In spring, what do people wear?

Sarah: People wear mid-season jackets, women start wearing loafers. I think people dress more "casually". In summer, the trend continues. Women wear sandals, flashy colors, shorts or mini-skirts. Men wear polo shirts. We all wear sunglasses.

Wentworth: What about autumn?

Sarah: We go back to mid-season jackets. We start to wear trench coats. Everyone have sweaters and trousers on. Summer is over. The colors are dull: beige, brown, grey and black. I hate that season!

Wentworth: Sarah, you're too critical. Season change is necessary, and it is beautiful to see how Nature rearranges itself, isn't it?
