Dialogue:

W: Sarah, did you know that Christianity is the religion with the largest following in the world, but Islam is the fastest growing?

Sarah: without doubt, knowing moreover that the Catholic Church has always been against the ordination of women into priesthood, and in France the need for priests is greater than ever.

W: what is really scary is also the fact that historically most of the wars were generated by religions. On this matter Tony Blair said that the nine-eleven attacks were 'no more a reflection of true Islam than the Crusades were a reflection of true Christianity'.

Sarah: well, I think that like any faith, Islam is a religion of peace, as are also Hinduism, Buddhism, or Shintoism.
