### Dialogue:

Sarah: as far as I know, she has a head trauma, many haematomas and bruises on the face but apparently she didn't fracture her jaw. She had a shoulder dislocation and is in a lot of pain.

W: That's horrible, poor her... What about her hips and legs?

Sarah: She has a swollen and painful knee as it hit the dashboard in the impact. I don't know yet if they will treat the fracture with a surgery, or if she'll only have a cast. Then she has two twists in the wrists and many skin abrasions all over the body.

W: will she get aftereffects or scars? There's nothing worse than that to remind you of the accident every day.

Sarah: Honestly I don't know yet, as I need to meet the ICU consultant. But they already told me to rent a wheelchair and crutches for when she's going back home... I am still a bit in shock; I don't know what to do and where to start...

W: Well you know what? Come back to the hospital, you'll be more useful staying with her than being worried here. If I can do something to help you, please do not hesitate to ask me.
